Exit Criteria and Regulations of the English Language Proficiency Requirements for the Graduation of Bachelor's Degree Students, from Academic Year 2020

The Faculty of International Studies has revised the program of the Bachelor of Arts in International Business: China and International Studies (international program/revised program for academic year 2020) with the policy and purpose of ensuring that the graduating students from these programs are able to communicate professionally in English as required in the quality assurance of international programs, 2020. Accordingly, new students of academic year 2020 and thereafter are required to achieve a standard English proficiency test and reach a minimum required score to graduate from the university as detailed below.

Students must achieve no less than a 500 TOEIC score or one of the following standard English proficiency tests with the minimum required score at the same level (or other standard English proficiency tests which are approved by Faculty of International Studies committee) as follows:

Type of Tests	Minimum Required Scores
TOEIC	No less than 500
PSU-Test	No less than 60%
Tell Me More: Achievement Test	No less than 500
TOEFL iBT	No less than 64
IELTS	No less than level 5

On a case by case basis, students who are not able to comply with this announcement nor achieve the exit criteria and regulations of the English language proficiency requirements for the graduation of a bachelor's degree may be able to achieve a required score at a later date. Regarding such cases, they will be considered by the Faculty of International Studies committee.

This announcement is effective from 21 September 2020.
